- CLOSE:** All entry forms are to be submitted with the correct fees by Friday 14th June 2019. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Executive, but double entry fees may be applicable.
- DELIVERY:** Please carefully note dates and times for the delivery of exhibits. On delivery of entries stewards in respective sections will issue with an individual exhibit ticket/number, exhibits will remain at the showgrounds for the duration of the show -unless otherwise stated.
- COLLECTION:** Exhibit tickets are required for the collection of exhibits and prize money vouchers. Exhibits uncollected within week following the show may be disposed of at the Society's discretion.
- PRIZE MONEY:** Prize money vouchers are available from the stewards in individual sections, your exhibit ticket may be requested. Prize money voucher may be presented at the Cashier's Office, ground floor, Foskey Pavillion, from 12 noon to 6pm on Thursday and on Friday and Saturday from 11am to 7pm of the show. Presentation of prize money voucher is required for identification to claim prize. Prizes for out of town exhibits NOT ATTENDING the show will be forwarded on request. If due to unforeseen circumstances sponsorship is not forthcoming prizes/money will not be paid by RASNT. Prize money can be collect, week 1 after show 9 am - 3.30 pm after that 9 am - 4 pm Monday to Friday.
PRIZE MONEY NOT COLLECTED BY THE 31 AUGUST 2019, WILL BE FORFEITED.
- BUSINESSES:** Prize money will be increased to cover the GST by 10%. Where prize money is in excess of \$50 the Society will generate a recipient based invoice if required. If no ABN is provided the Society must retain 48.5% of the prize money to be forwarded to the Australian Taxation Office. All prize money quoted is exclusive of GST.
- PLEASE NOTE:** All online entries and payments will close on Friday 14 June 2019.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. Show admission fee must be paid by all exhibitors other than Members.
2. Exhibitors or their agents, when called upon by the Stewards or the Council, shall prove the correctness of their entries.
3. All entries to be made in writing on the appropriate entry form and lodged with the Chief Executive by the date stated in the Schedule of Prizes together with the correct entry fees.
4. **PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT - EXHIBITORS** the information provided by you on entry forms is collected and used by the Royal Agricultural Society of the Northern Territory Inc (RASNT) to organise and conduct competitions at the Royal Darwin Show. We may publish details such as your Name, Address and Exhibit details in any RASNT publication or communication. Such information may also be made available to, and published by, the media. We will not disclose your personal information without your consent for any other purpose unless required or authorised by law. You may request access to your personal information and, if necessary, request that our records of that information be corrected by contacting the Chief Executive, in writing to RASNT PO Box 39600 Winnellie NT 0821.
- 4a. **PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT - SPACEHOLDERS** The information provided by you in application forms is collected and used by the Royal Agricultural Society of the Northern Territory Inc. (RASNT) to organise and promote the Royal Darwin Show. We may publish details such as your Name, Address and Exhibit details in any RASNT publication or communication. Such information may also be made available to, and published by, the media. We will not disclose your personal information without your consent for any other purpose unless required or authorised by law. You may request access to your personal information and, if necessary, request that our records of that information be corrected by contacting the Chief Executive, in writing to RASNT PO Box 39600 Winnellie NT 0821.
5. All exhibitors of birds and livestock, with the exception of horses MUST be the bona fide owners at the time of entry.
6. All exhibits in Sections J, JJ, K, KK, L, LL, M, MM, N, NN, O, U, must be grown or made by the exhibitor or must be the work of the exhibitor.
7. Any share farmer has the right to object to his produce being entered in other than his own name.
8. Any exhibitor proved to have knowingly made false entries for a prize, or to have wilfully infringed any of the rules, will render himself liable to be adjudged by the Council from receiving any prize awarded to him.
9. The Council of the Society shall have the power without assigning any reason to:
 - (a) Reject or cancel any entry at any time.
 - (b) Prohibit the participation by any person or exhibit in any event or class for which it is entered.
 - (c) Cancel any event, class or section.
 - (d) Alter the time at which any event is to take place.
 - (e) Alter the conditions of any event.
 - (f) Remove any exhibit from the Showgrounds.
 - (g) Alter the date or time for the closing of entries for any section or class for any particular entry.
 - (h) Transfer an exhibit or exhibitor from any class to any other class.
10. All persons who, after entering, shall be unable to exhibit same through unforeseen circumstances, shall be expected to notify the Chief Executive of their inability to exhibit at least three clear days before the date of judging.
11. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the judges appointed by the Council and on all protests, the decisions of the Council shall be final and without appeal.
12. Vehicles conveying exhibits will be admitted to the ground but must leave when unloaded or when requested to do so by Council Members and stewards.

13. AGGREGATE AWARDS: A separate entry is not required for these awards. Three points will be awarded for a first prize in each class, two points for a second prize and one point for a third prize. In the event of a tie, two points will be awarded for Championships. Such additional points will be awarded only to those exhibitors who tied in the original allocation. Does not, apply to Show Jumping.
14. WITH THE EXCEPTION OF LIVESTOCK NO EXHIBITOR SHALL BE PERMITTED TO BE WITH THE STEWARDS OR THE JUDGES DURING THE TIME OF JUDGING. THE EXHIBITS OF ANY PERSON INFRINGING THIS RULE SHALL BE IMMEDIATELY DISQUALIFIED.
15. It shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the Judges and, if necessary, to order the removal of such offenders. Persons in charge of any livestock exhibit must on no account address the Judges, or leave their exhibits during the adjudication of the Judges, unless authorized by the stewards in the section in which they are competing.
16. No exhibit shall be removed from the Show before the times stipulated in the special regulations for each section, without the special permission of the Chief Stewards in the section. All exhibits shall be delivered at their respective sections at stated times.
17. No livestock, other animal or bird exhibits shall be removed from the Show Grounds during the duration of the Show. The Chief Steward, Ring Secretary or Show Manager of any livestock section may authorise removal of any exhibit at any time upon such terms and conditions as they think fit.
18. Should the Council have any reason to suspect that any exhibit is diseased or dangerous, they reserve the right to refuse admission thereof to the Showground or to remove same from the ground at the expense of the exhibitor.
19. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident that may be caused to or by an exhibit and will not, under any circumstances, be responsible for any loss or non-delivery of livestock or other exhibit of any kind, or any injury done thereto.
20. An exhibitor or competitor may protest against an award won by an exhibit or competitor in the same class alleging infringement of the rules or ineligibility. All protests shall be delivered to the Chief Executive in writing within 24 hours from the notification of the Judge's award, accompanied by a fee of \$20.00 which will be forfeited if the protest is found to be unfounded or frivolous. It shall be the duty of the person protesting to produce evidence to support his/her allegation. Protests and all matters arising there from shall be determined as soon as possible by the Society's Executive. Should any exhibit which has been awarded a prize be disqualified the next in order of award does not necessarily become entitled to the prize.
21. Honorary Veterinary Surgeons listed are acting in an advisory capacity only. All exhibitors are responsible for their own veterinary care. A list of Surgeons is available from the Chief Executive's Office.
22. Prize money will be paid out at the Cashier's Office, Ray Foskey Pavilion. 12.00pm to 6.00pm on Thursday. Friday and Saturday from 11.00am to 7.00pm. Prize money not collected by 31st August 2019 will be forfeited.
23. Where nominated "Special Awards" will apply and if a judge selects an entry for the "Special Award" then the winner will receive both the prize-money and the "Special Award".
24. The whole arrangement as to position, classification and grouping of exhibits shall be under the control of the Council.
25. No award ribbons or cards shall be placed on any exhibit until Judging in that class has been completed.
26. Exhibitors may arrange their exhibits under the direction of the Council:
- 26a. After being penned, no person other than the Council's representative or the exhibitor or his representatives will be allowed to handle any livestock prior to being judged. (Any other person infringing regulations 26 and 26a is liable to expulsion from the ground).

27. Any exhibitor or attendant refusing to display a Prize Card when awarded and to keep the same on during the hours of exhibiting will, on proof thereof to the Council, forfeit all prizes awarded during the Show and may be disqualified from again competing.
28. One Prize Card only is issued for each prize won.
29. Exhibitors will render themselves liable to a penalty of \$50 by removing any official Prize Card or ribbon in lieu thereof, or by refusing in any way to carry out instructions and the Society shall incur no responsibility by enforcing these regulations. The Council shall have the power to retain any or all of the exhibits until fines are paid.
30. Any exhibitor bringing an exhibit to the ground and willfully failing to exhibit shall be liable to disqualification during the pleasure of the Council, on the recommendation of the Chief Stewards, the Council may disqualify all his other exhibits and no entry fees shall be returned.
31. Any person disqualified by the Board of Appeals of a Royal Agricultural Society of any State or Territory, will not be allowed to exhibit or take part in this Show in any capacity whatsoever.
32. Persons contravening any of the Society's Rules or Regulations may forfeit any prize which may have been awarded to them.
33. The Council may, at any time, disqualify from exhibiting either indefinitely or for such periods as it may think fit, an exhibitor who has, in the opinion of the Council, been guilty of any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or whose conduct, whether at or during any Show of the Society or at any other time has, in the opinion of the Council been such that he is unfit to compete at any Show of the Society.
34. No person who has been disqualified from exhibiting at any Show of the Society shall be allowed during the period of disqualification to act as agent, representative or servant of any exhibitor of any Show of the Society.
35. During the period of disqualification, no entry will be received from any person disqualified by the Society and should any entry be accidentally received it shall be deemed to be void and the entry fee will be returned.
36. No person other than those authorized shall be allowed in the Show arena during the progress of the ring events program.
37. **Ribbon colours denote:**
PURPLE - Grand Champion
GREEN - Reserve Grand Champion
RED, WHITE and BLUE - Champion
BLUE and WHITE - Reserve Champion
BLUE - First prize
RED - Second prize
WHITE - Third prize.
38. The exhibitor or his representative shall clean out livestock pens in which his entries are exhibited, twice a day – early in the morning and last thing at night.
39. Any person committing a public nuisance on the ground, or collecting money without permission, may be removed by any member of the Council, with or without the assistance of the police.
40. The Show will take place where and when the Council shall appoint.
41. The Society reserves the right at any time to postpone the Show or any part thereof in consequence of the weather or for any other sufficient cause, to a date or dates deemed suitable by the Council and no entrance fees shall be returnable in the event of such postponements. The reasonableness of the cause or causes for postponement shall be decided by the Society and shall not be open to question by any exhibitor or person affected by such judgement.
42. The Council may abandon the Show or any part thereof through wet weather or any

other reason which may make such course advisable. Should the Show or any part be abandoned or cancelled exhibitors shall be entitled to a return of their entrance fees paid, but no cause for action, liability or obligation shall be maintainable or be incurred by reason of such abandonment or cancellation.

43. The contractors for the supply of refreshments and Stallholders must lie in supplies between 7.00am and 8.45am each day, unless under special unavoidable circumstances, when written permission may be obtained from the C.E.O. Only one vehicle pass will be supplied to a stallholder.
44. No entertainment shall be allowed on the ground without special permission of the Council.
45. Exhibitors are allowed the privilege of distributing Trade Lists, advertisements or other suchlike documents at their stands.
46. The use of loudspeakers, amplifying equipment or other excessively noisy equipment is prohibited during the currency of the Show, except in cases where permission has been granted and special arrangements made by the C.E.O.
47. Application for space for stands, machinery, implements, stalls, game or other entertainment will be received by the C.E.O and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$220, the minimum charge for space is \$220. If applications are not cancelled prior to the 30th April the deposit will be forfeited to the Society. The Society reserves the right to reject any application. Space cancelled after the 21st June must be paid in full.
48. Applicants must state for what purpose the space will be used and advise whether water or electrical provision required.
49. Stalls must have staff in attendance from 9.00am to 10.00pm each day of the Show.
50. Space will not be regarded as allocated to an applicant until the full amount specified has been paid by the final date for payment of the 17th June 2019. The Society reserves itself the right to let any site to any other applicant or applicants in the event of the foregoing conditions not being complied with.
51. Should any site allocated to a space holder be not occupied by him at the commencement of the Society's Show, the Society may, without prejudice to any other right or remedy it may have, cancel the allocation of such site and may re-allocate the site to another person or persons. Monies paid by the defaulting space holder will be forfeited to the funds of the Society.
52. No camping in the Showgrounds by Space holders or staff will be permitted unless authorised by the Society.
53. A space holder will not occupy the site or sites allocated to him until the specified monies have been paid in full.
54. The Space must be used ONLY for the purpose specified on the Space Allotment Card.
55. The space holder may, subject to compliance with rules and regulations, take up possession of his/her site 3 days before the opening of the Show or earlier at the discretion of the C.E.O. Work on stalls will only be permitted between 8.00am and 8.00pm each day.
56. Space holders are to ensure that side-show exhibits and stalls are kept in a clean and tidy condition at all times and that all employees or attendants are clean and tidily dressed and conduct themselves in an orderly manner at all times. Drinking of alcohol is prohibited while working on any stall.
57. Games of chance are strictly PROHIBITED: all games must be games of skill. Approved lotteries and raffles must have written permission from the Society.
58. The space holder shall indemnify the Society against any liability in respect of any breach by a space holder of any rule or regulation issued for the present being in force and which may impose any liability on the Society.
59. Sub-letting of space is prohibited. The space holder must occupy the site allocated to him/her solely for the purpose of his/her own business as specified.
60. All stalls, exhibits etc. must be removed from the Showground commencing at 8.00am on

the Sunday after the Show and not later than one week after the termination of the Show, except in cases where special arrangements have been made and approval in writing given by the C.E.O.

61. The Society reserves the right to cancel the contract and remove any space holder from the Showgrounds if any games played on the site are declared by a member of the police force to be illegal or if there is any other infringement by the space holder, and in any such case, the space holder will be liable to forfeit all monies paid or payable in connection with the site.
62. The Society shall have the right to remove at any time, from the Showgrounds any side-show, stall or exhibit which is in the opinion of the Board of the Society, objectionable and may remove from the Showgrounds the spaceholder, proprietor, employees, or attendants connected with any such sideshow stall or exhibit or who, is guilty of conduct which is, in the opinion of the Board objectionable or which may be detrimental to the Society's interests, and no person removed shall have any right of action or claim for damages, costs, expenses or otherwise against the Society in respect of any action taken by the Society under these regulations.
63. All Space holders must have their name or allotment number clearly and prominently displayed on their stands in letters which are clearly visible.
64. All Space holders shall remain within their frontage and not work beyond one metre of their boundary.
65. Security will commence at 8.00pm on the Wednesday night and 10.00pm on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights and concludes at 8.00am each morning. It is the responsibility of the stallholders to secure their goods and property at 8.00am on the Sunday following the Show.
66. Commercial photographers will not be permitted within the Showground unless authorised by the C.E.O.
67. Space holders are prohibited from selling, giving away or using as prizes the following: water-pistols, fireworks or any other article which would cause annoyance to the public at the Showgrounds.
Please note: Banned items are listed in the stallholders Handbook.
68. All charges for S.G.A. space must be paid in full before 10.00am on the last day of the Show.
69. Metal spikes, piping etc. may not be driven into sealed surfaces under any circumstances. Sleeves may be cemented into sealed surfaces, however, but only after permission has been obtained from the Council.
70. The space holder will not be allowed to erect signs, streamers, sign-boards or structures which in the opinion of the Council will be an obstruction to the Society or any other person or which in the opinion of the Council, are for any other reason undesirable.
71. Any damage done to the roads, grounds or buildings, by the space holder must be made good by the space holder to the satisfaction of the Council.
72. The Council will not admit to the Showgrounds any vehicle which in its opinion may, through its nature or weight, cause damage to the roadways, or any other part of the Showgrounds.
73. The Society will not be responsible for any accident which may be caused through or by the space holder or which may happen in connection with his/her business and the space holder shall save the Society harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from every such accident.
74. The Society will not under any circumstances be responsible for any loss or misdelivery of exhibits at the Society's Show or for any damage done thereto. Stallholders are responsible for insuring their own property and stock. Stallholders must comply with statutory insurance requirements which include insurance in respect of motor vehicles and workers' compensation.

75. The space holder and his/her employees will at all times comply with the Rules and Regulations of the Society including those contained in the Stallholders booklet and will obey all instructions issued by the authorised representative of the Society, relative to the use of the site occupied.
76. All exhibits in Foskey Hall, Commercial Hall, Motor Displays and Agricultural implement displays and any other stalls must be completed by 8.45am on the first day of the Show and shall remain undisturbed until closing time on the last day of the Show. Removal of exhibits and stalls is not permitted until after 8.00am on the Sunday following the Show.
77. All vehicles not part of an exhibit must be removed from grounds by 8.45am each day of the Show.

STEWARDS AND JUDGES.

Stewards and Judges are requested to study all regulations and to take particular note of duties set out below.

78. Stewards are responsible for seeing the exhibits are properly classed, recording the entry and that all exhibits in such classes are grouped together for judging.
80. Stewards will attend on Judges to afford any information required but will not do or say anything to influence the Judge's decisions. They must not reveal the name of the exhibitor or repeat any remarks that the Judges make to each other.
81. Stewards will obtain the award book from the Judge when it is filled in and signed and deliver the same to the Chief Executive from whom they will obtain prize cards and positions. They will collate the aggregates for special awards and return all Stewards and Judges books with the totals to the Chief Executive.
82. Judges will attend the Chief Executive's office at the Showgrounds at the hour appointed, report to the Chief Executive for direction to the Chief Steward of his/her section.
83. Judges, when they have reached a decision, will at once write the number of the exhibit, with any remarks they may desire to make, in the award book.
84. Judges may recommend for a prize any exhibit of special merit not included in the Schedule of Prizes. Apart from Specified Championships, a Champion Card may be awarded in any section, if sufficient merit and competition.
85. First, second, third, will be prizes awarded to any exhibit. Judges are empowered and are instructed not to award any prizes to any exhibit which they consider is not of sufficient merit.
86. In the event of Judges awarding equal first there will be no second prize awarded; In the event of Judges awarding equal second there will be no third prize awarded; If equal third prize is awarded this be divided equally; Full aggregate points are allotted to each competitor awarded an equal prize.

ENTRIES CLOSE: Friday 21st June 2019.

Prizes sponsored by the Royal Agricultural Society of the NT Inc. (except where otherwise stated).

INFORMATION: For information relating to entries, the Ring Secretary may be contacted on 0407 322 842 AH.

ENTRIES: **All entries to be made in writing on the proper forms and lodged with the Chief Executive by the closing date together with the correct fees.** Any exhibitor proved to have knowingly made false entries for a prize, or to have wilfully infringed any of the rules, will render him/herself liable to be adjudged by Council from receiving any prize awarded to him or her.

LATE ENTRIES: May be accepted at the Ring Secretary's discretion up to 2nd July 2019. Single class entries may be taken on the day previous to the event **BUT DOUBLE ENTRY FEES WILL APPLY. THE ONLY ENTRIES ACCEPTED AFTER THIS TIME WILL BE NOVELTY EVENTS.**

CLASHING OF CLASSES When entering classes from the Horse Schedule please be aware that due to limited time available there are likely to be clashing between some classes. We are aware of these and every endeavour has been made to eliminate them, where possible. However, due to horses having multiple registrations and classes being held at the same time, in different rings, it is not possible to eliminate all class clashes. Your cooperation will be much appreciated.

NUMBERS: Competitors are required to purchase their own bridle/breast plate number holders. Holders will not be supplied by the RASNT. Any competitor not displaying a number will not be allowed to enter the ring.

POINT OF ENTRY: Will be via Hook Road, gates open at 5:00am.

PARKING: Parking provided follow signs. **NO PARKING IN CAMPING AREA (CAMPER'S ONLY ALLOWED).**

CAMPING: Space is limited therefore will be made available firstly to out of town exhibitors. To be eligible for space exhibitors **MUST SLEEP IN CAMPING AREA** and stable horses overnight. Exhibitors found to be using camping space for parking and storage will be evicted and refused camping space in future. Campers are required to advise number of campers on entry form. Wristbands must be worn and will be issued from the ring office.

CAMPING RESTRICTED TO FINANCIAL MEMBERS ONLY.

WARM-UP: Areas are provided at rear of stables. Warming up horses in other areas, including **MARSHALLING AREA and STABLE AREA, IS PROHIBITED.**

FEED & WATER: Feeding and watering is the responsibility of the owner.

HEALTH: All horses must be free from contagious disease. Veterinary inspections may be carried out at any time and any horse which in the opinion of the Veterinarian shows signs of any contagious disease shall if the Society so orders be removed from the Showgrounds by the exhibitor or at his/her expense. See also General Regulation 18. Veterinary services see General Regulation 21.

ILL TREATMENT: OF HORSES - at any time on the Showgrounds shall result in the disqualification from further competition of the person/persons concerned.

STOCK MOVEMENT: Exhibitors should ensure that any requirements for the movement of stock are complied with under the NT Livestock act. For information contact Inspectors DPI&R, Animal biosecurity Office, Berrimah Farm during normal business hours. Stock Inspector on 8999 2034 or 0401 115 802. No stock shall be removed before completion of the Grand Parade on Friday or Saturday of the Show. See also General Reg.15.

- TICK AREAS:** HORSES MOVING FROM TICK INFECTED AREAS TO TICK FREE AREAS.
From Interstate: Horses require a Health Certificate. Unless the horses originate from tick free areas, an inspection and supervised treatment is also required. From Tick Areas within the Northern Territory (North of Dunmarra) to Tick Free Areas: Horses require a permit and an inspection and supervised treatment for cattle tick.
- HENDRA VIRUS:** Competitors' horses which have travelled from Queensland and New South Wales within 30 days of coming to the Darwin Showgrounds must be vaccinated against Hendra and a vaccination certificate must be produced.
- GRAND PARADES:** ALL EXHIBITORS MUST TAKE PART IN THE GRAND PARADE ON THE DAY OF JUDGING. Failure to parade without an exemption will result in prize money being forfeited and a fine of \$100. If fines are not paid within 30 days of notice, future entries may be refused. **Prize money will not be paid to those who do not take part in the Grand Parade.**
- EXEMPTIONS:** From the Grand Parade may be requested in writing to the Ring Secretary prior to either Grand Parade. The Society at its sole discretion may grant or withhold any exemption. Repeated exemptions on the grounds of intractability may result in future nominations being refused for that exhibit.
- PRIZEMONEY:** Will be paid at the Cashier's Office, Foskey Pavilion. Thursday 2:00pm to 6:00pm. Friday AFTER GRAND PARADE to 7:00pm. Presentation of prize money voucher is required for identification. Prize money NOT collect by 30th August 2019, will be forfeited.
- MEASURING:** All horses entered in height specified classes MUST have a current measuring certificate. Horses entered in EA or SHC classes must have a current height certificate from the relevant association. NO Certificate – No Entry. Measuring will not be carried out at the showgrounds. Any enquiries regarding measuring, should be made to the Ring Secretary on 0407 322 842 AH. Copies of current certificates must be attached to the entries.
- REGISTRATION:** CERTIFICATES must be current and must be produced to the Marshal upon request before entering the Ring in specified classes.
- MARSHALLING:** The Ring Secretary will only call the class number and class description and not individual competitors. Competitors must report to the Marshal for identification, produce height and registration certificates where specified they then must remain in the designated areas. Marshal area will be closed when the final competitor commences work out in the preceding class. Once the marshalling area is closed NO competitor will be allowed to enter.
- ETIQUETTE:** Competitors will at all times display correct Ring manners to Judges and Stewards. Failure to do so will result in exclusion from the particular event and a report to Council. Further action at Council discretion.
- DRESS:** Suitable attire must be worn by handlers and riders in all classes. Any handler or rider who, in the opinion of the Society, is not properly attired, will not be allowed to compete. This also applies to led-in classes and the Grand Parade.
- HEADGEAR:** Protective Headgear - All Juniors under 18 years are required to wear protective headgear to the current Australian Standard ASA/NZS 3838, VGI and EN1384 (European Standard) or ASTM F1163. For all EA sponsored classes EN1384 and top hats are not permitted. This applies to all led-in, ridden and driven classes and to riders in warm-up areas. NO exceptions will be made. All persons regardless of age must wear same headgear when lunging horses.
- EQUIPMENT:** SADDLERY must be in a safe condition to the satisfaction of the Society or the exhibitor will not be allowed to compete.

OTHER:

ALL THOSE COMPETING DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK.

SWAB TEST:

TEST and SWABBING FOR DRUGS and STIMULANTS: The Society may make or cause to be made any test of any exhibit to determine whether any drug or stimulant has been administered to such exhibit and may take possession of any such exhibit for any of the aforesaid purpose and detain such horse for such period as deemed necessary. Drugs mean any substance capable of altering the performance or behaviour of a horse by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the respiratory system, the alimentary digestive system, the muscular skeletal system, or the urogenital system and shall include analgesics, antihistamines, anti-inflammatory agents, blood coagulants, diuretics, hormones and their synthetic counterparts, corticosteroids, anabolic steroids, local anaesthetics, muscle relaxants and tranquillizers and vitamins administered by injection or ingestion. Any exhibit which has been brought to the Showgrounds and is found by the Society to have had administered to it any drug as defined above may be disqualified from any event or class for which it has competed or entered in the Show. When any horse which is on the Showgrounds for the purpose of taking part in a class or event at the Show is found procedure can be obtained from the Ring Secretary.

PROGRAM TIMES: Are a guide only. The Society reserves the right to vary the order of classes and to amalgamate classes where there are insufficient entries. Classes will not be delayed for exhibitors competing in other Rings at the same time. A further programme will be available prior to the Show from the Secretary's Office or the Announcing Stand during the show. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that he/she is ready for any event in which he/she is entered.

CHAMPIONSHIPS: Judging will not be delayed for competitors.

CHAMPION: First place getters of specified classes must parade for judging of Championship events.

RESERVE CHAMP: Second place getters of specified classes must stand by for judging of Reserve Champion. **Failure to parade for these Championship events without a Veterinary Certificate (for horses) OR a Doctors Certificate (for riding classes), will result in prize money being forfeited.**

REGULATIONS: General Regulations 1 - 38 apply. Please read SPECIAL REGULATIONS for specific classes.

PLEASE READ: Special Regulations - All Horse Events". **SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR LED - IN CLASSES:**

REG. & HEIGHT:

Proof of registration and height will be required before entering the Ring. Must be current.

STALLIONS: Stallions are to be shown in a bit and bridle, handler/rider must be 18 years and over. Green stallion Disc must be worn.

REGISTRATION:

Horses registered with more than one breed society or association may be entered in all classes for which they are registered. A.O.B. (Any Other Breed) Classes are restricted to horses that are **not eligible** to enter a specific breed or classification class.

NT BRED: For the purpose of RASNT events, Territory Bred shall be defined as "horses that have been foaled within the Northern Territory, including within 100km radius of the border".

REG. NUMBERS:

Registration numbers for specified classes must be clearly marked on entry form.

SHOW HORSE/HUNTER:

Horses may only compete as either show horse or show hunter, not both.

He was one of the most decorated show Galloways to come to the Territory, qualifying for Grand Nationals every year of his life from the age of 3, and winning ribbons and garlands in every State and Territory across the country (except for WA and Tasmania). He was the ultimate show horse, coming alive as soon as he entered the arena with a spring in his step and a sparkle in his eye. There could have been no better teacher for Ella; it wasn't always easy but always rewarding. One of his last shows with the family was Darwin Royal 2015 where he won Supreme Ridden Exhibit, what a fitting end to a spectacular career. Bubba sadly lost his battle with laminitis and was laid to rest in June 2015, taking a little piece of many people's hearts with him. Vale Bubba.



Certificate for Cat Flu and Feline Enteritis at vetting in.
2. No kitten under 84 days may be shown.
3. Any female cat obviously in kitten must not be shown.
4. All entry fees must accompany entry forms, which shall be completed in ink and either printed or typed.
5. All entries, whether exhibited or not must be paid for.
6. All cats (excluding companion cats) MUST be registered with the Cat Association of the NT Inc. GPO Box 3870, Darwin NT 0801, and have registration numbers on the entry form. Exhibits generally domiciled outside the N.T. must be registered with the controlling body of that state.
7. No foodstuff to be left in cages or given prior to judging. Water in a plain container is supplied.
8. All exhibits benched must have curtains and a base towel or blanket in their cage. Coloured curtains are available for hire.
9. No dyes or colouring matter is allowed on exhibits. Powders or sprays are NOT to be used in the Show Venue.
10. No sashes, prize cards etc., other than those won at this show are to be displayed.
11. Pedigree litters exhibited as such must be LITTER REGISTERED irrespective of individual registration. If entered in individual events, they must be separately registered. Prefix must also have recognised registration.

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



 - b) All entry forms must be signed by the photographer.
 - c) A maximum of four photographs is permitted in each class.
 - d) Any item previously entered in the Royal Darwin Show is ineligible.
 - e) Each photograph may only be entered in a single category (even if digitally manipulated to appear different)
2. Blank or untitled entries will not be accepted.
3. The right is reserved to transfer any entry to a correct class if wrongly classified by the exhibitor.
4. Any class which receives fewer than four entries or is entered by only one exhibitor will be deemed void. Entries will be transferred to an appropriate class.
5. Exhibits will be judged by arrangement with the Darwin Camera Club Inc.
6. While the greatest care will be taken with entries no liability will be accepted for loss or damage of photographs or packaging.
7. **DEFINITIONS:**

MONOCHROME: An image of a single colour in differing shades - only black and white or sepia-toned images will be accepted.

PEOPLE: Any picture of a person or people where humanity is the dominant aspect of the subject. Includes portrait, group, nude, and child study, action at work or play.

NATURE: Restricted to wild, uncultivated, untamed subjects. Includes birds, animals, insects, wildflowers, geological phenomena. Specifically excludes garden flowers, general landscapes, domestic/caged animals/birds and pets.

OPEN: May be pictures of any subject.

PHOTOJOURNALISM:

Story-telling pictures, including social comment and dedication of community, industrial, political, social, sporting and travel events.

LANDSCAPE/SEASCAPES: Pictures of natural scenery (landscape) or natural coastal scenery, wave study or the open sea (seascape). It may include evidence of human activity/structures, people or animals provided that none of these elements dominate the photograph.

EXPERIMENTAL/FINE ART: Pictures that display a novel effect or which have been modified using an experimental technique. The picture must always have a basic photographic image. Digital manipulation may be employed provided the entrant exposed the original photograph.

NORTHERN TERRITORY: Any picture that depicts the character, landscape or people of the Northern Territory.

DIGITAL: The digital photography section is for images submitted on a Memory Stick in digital format (Memory Stick/s may not be returned to entrants). Prints made from photographs taken using digital cameras may be entered in all print categories.

REGULATIONS - PRINTS (see check list on opposite page)

1. The exhibitors's name, class and the word TOP to indicate correct orientation must be on the reverse side of every print. Prints with identification marks or titles on the front will not be accepted.
2. Prints (other than postcard size) are to be no larger (including mount) than 8 inches x 12 inches (20cm x 30cm) or A4. Postcard size Classes 10, 11 and 12 are restricted to prints of 5 inches x 7 inches (13cm x 18cm) or smaller. Postcards are not to be mounted i.e. the backing should not appear as a border.
3. Original exposure must be by the exhibitor. Processing and printing may be done commercially. Photographs must be printed on paper media (i.e. not on canvas or other non-paper medium).
4. Photos may be cardboard mounted or backed but is optional, with one photo per mount. Glass, wood or metal framing is unacceptable.
5. Each exhibitor is to place small piece of Velcro on the back of each photo, on each corner and one (1) piece in the middle. The Velcro is to be the hook Velcro (scratchy), so it can be stuck onto carpet board. The Velcro may be placed on top of pieces of masking tape (optional), so when the Velcro is removed the photo isn't damaged.
6. Entries in Class 7 Landscapes, Class 8 Photojournalism, Class 9 Experimental, Class 10 People, Class 11 Nature, Class 12 Open and Class 13 Specialty Category may be either monochrome or colour.






